Forthcoming reviews about The Teaching of the Anatomical Sciences

If we, as anatomists, are to teach our students effectively and ensure that they have sufficient anatomical knowledge to be safe and effective practitioners of whatever profession they choose to follow, it is important for us to understand how we can best teach our subject to support the learning of our students. Therefore, we are pleased to welcome the appearance in the *European Journal of Anatomy* of the first of what will be a series of papers on *The Teaching of the Anatomical Sciences*. This is a major project being produced by members of the Trans European Pedagogic Anatomical Research Group (TEPARG).
